

The March 2017 Watershed Council program features guest speaker Noah Kugler, P.G., M.S., of H2O Geosolutions. Noah will be on the FGCU campus 1:30 - 2:45 on the afternoon of March 16 presenting his talk, "Geology of Florida: Challenges and Risks of Unconventional Oil Exploration."

Noah is a licensed professional geologist in the state of Florida and principal of a well-respected hydrogeologic consulting company in the Fort Myers area with 18 years of experience in groundwater consulting and regulation. Noah earned a Bachelor of Science degree in geology from Temple University in Philadelphia and a Masters of Science degree in geology from the University of South Florida specializing in groundwater modeling. Noah was formerly a water use permitting supervisor with the South Florida Water Management District and is considered an expert in Florida water resources, management and sustainability.

The presentation will be in Seidler Hall room 220, attended by about 70 students of Don Duke's springtime cluster of Water Resources classes - promising a lively interaction with plenty of time for Q&A. A one-page flier is attached.
